These include the many hidden pieces of infrastructure – from HR policies and technological upgrades to development planning – which support the top layer and give structure to our quilt. As you read through the following pages, I hope you will appreciate how deeply interconnected all of these layers are. We are proud of the work we are doing at Kavana, on every level.

With the support of Project Accelerate, Kavana devoted significant time over the past two years to several important capacity-building initiatives.

Since March 2022, we've grown our core staff team to five strong, and we've implemented new HR policies and updated our staff handbook. All of these internal practices make Kavana a great place to work and support a staff culture that mirrors our community's values.



We also devoted behind-thescenes energy to strengthening our development muscles. The "What's Your Why" campaign (Fall 2022) was a tremendous success, exceeding our goal of raising \$300,000 in order to unlock a matching gift from Project Accelerate. Huge thanks – and a big high five – to our all-star committee: Dana Bettinger (chair), Lisa Colton, Ingrid Elliott, Rebecca Kaplan, Ronnie Levitt, Sharon London, and John Policar.

Finally, in Spring 2023, a new Growth

Committee was convened to think about how our community is growing and to make recommendations about how best to manage and guide growth in alignment with what makes Kavana so special. We look forward to learning from their work during the coming year.

YOU MAKE OUR QUILT POSSIBLE: FINANCIAL UPDATE & DONOR LIST

Kavana's beautiful community quilt is made possible by our many community supporters, including you! Our financial picture is solid – we are happy to report that we are on-track with our multi-year budget. At the same time, our expenses are on the rise, and we are evermindful of the need for ongoing community support.

The numbers to the right tell a story of planned growth and careful management of resources. Between FY 2022 and FY 2024 (the coming year), our expenses are increasing as our organization works to support our growing community of partners in their Jewish lives. FY 2023 is the anomalous year – with an infusion of income from our Project Accelerate grant, our successful "What's Your Why" campaign, and even an unexpected Sabbatical grant for Rabbi Rachel Nussbaum.

We currently have 6 months of fully liquid operating reserves on hand and plan to continue to spend these down on staffing and investments to strengthen our community. This will leave us with an ongoing 3-4 months of future operating reserves, which we will maintain at all times. We have also invested wisely. We have carefully allocated an additional 4 months of strategic reserves on a combination of zero or low-risk assets, currently in fixed-rate CDs and ESG (environmental, social, governance) funds.

Most of the Project Accelerate income was received this year, but a number of projects will wrap up in the coming year. This, coupled with our larger staff team and rising costs (everything seems more expensive these days, from venue rentals to food for programming, etc.), plus new experiments, like a different High Holiday venue to fit our community's needs, means that we are deliberately preparing to operate at a deficit in FY 2024.
